Announcement to celebrate Veer Diwas: Prime Minister Modi ji has announced to celebrate Veer Diwas in 2021. The observance of which is being started today on 26th December 2022. Today, Honorable Prime Minister Narendra Modi will attend the Children's Day celebrations at Dhyanchand Stadium in New Delhi. Through this ceremony, the Prime Minister will introduce all the countrymen to the bravery and sacrifice of the Sahibzadas of Guru Gobind Singh.

Veer Bal Diwas is celebrated by honoring the sacrifice of four Sahibzadas of Kalasa. The young children of the last Sikh Guru Gobind Singh sacrificed their lives to protect their faith. It is also a day to remember their books and to see how they were brutally murdered – especially Zorawar and Adhyayan Singh. During a battle, Sahibzade was captured by the Mughal army on the banks of the Sarsa River. They were reportedly declared dead at the age of 8 and 5 for not believing in the religion of Islam.

This day falls on 26th December. This decision was taken in the year 2021 by the illustrious Prime Servant of the Government of India, Shri Narendra Damodar Das Modi. This is a commendable step. This decision has been welcomed by all the Sikh community. It will be celebrated for the first time on December 26, 2022.

Guruji's two younger Sahibzadas were martyred on this day in 1704 AD by the Mughal ruler Aurangzeb. At that time the ages of both the Sahibzadas were 9 years and 6 years. Sahibzade Zorawar Singh was only 9 years old and Sahibzade Fateh Singh was only 6 years old. Sahibzade had a lot of courage in this young form of age.

Sahibzadas were asked to accept Islam. But he remained fearless and said that he would not leave Sikhi and was ready to sacrifice his religion. Aurangzeb ordered both of them to be buried alive in the wall. Both the Sahibzadas showed fearlessness and courage and accepted it. When they were being carved into the wall, both of them were reciting Japji Sahib. As soon as the wall reached their shoulders, Aurangzeb mercilessly beheaded both the Sahibzadas and made them martyrs.

The martyrdom day of two such brave children who were martyred for their religion at a young age will be celebrated as Veer Bal Diwas. His sacrifice will always be a matter of pride for the coming generations and his name will always be written in golden letters in history. Gurudwara Shri Jyoti Sarup Sahib in Sirhind should be built in his memory. The land on which the palace is built was obtained from Aurangzeb by Diwan Todar Malji at that time by laying out gold coins in a tight position on the ground. And his last rites were performed. It is also known as Saka Sirhind.
